So bare bones you could get going with a griddle, set of tins, foil pans, three brushes, one large brush, a surface thermometer, set of silicone mats, a heat gun, wax, and three 6x6" cradle board for \$259.00. Then add in some sort of fan for ventilation.

I would add another \$100 to your budget. Encaustic paint is expensive and so luscious, it's hard to resist buying it. Some people will make their own colour with oil paint, but before you go down that road, be sure to research. I generally buy commercial encaustic paint and thin it out to make it last!
